## General Education and Elective Information for Human Development and Family Studies Majors

Electives for HDFS
<p><b>Elective credits</b> are defined as courses that do not meet any specific program requirement in specified categories.</p> <p><b>Every student in the HDFS major needs 120 credits to graduate.</b> (The degree audit/academic progress plan) monitors this.) Students need electives to reach the 120 credit requirement.</p> <p><b>To determine how many electives a student needs:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Take [the credits already earned + credits still needed for major/gen eds./etc.] and then subtract (-) from 120. The difference is the number of electives needed.</li> <li>• Students can work with an advisor to determine the number of electives needed.</li> </ul> <p><b>What courses count as electives?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ANY college-level course</li> <li>• Examples:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Minor courses</li> <li>2. Additional optional courses in the major</li> <li>3. Other courses the university offers (provided prerequisites have been met) can be used for electives. Sometimes students will take a class to expand their knowledge in an area or learn a new skill. Others will take a class with a friend that they are interested in. These can be used in the elective category.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
